2021 Year in Review




January 2021

We began the first of three months of meetings conducted by Zoom. Still, we passed the 2021 budget and signed up for projects. But we longed to meet in person.




February 2021

Garden Club members enjoyed a beautiful afternoon during a Victoria Valley Go Out and Learn. Members took a brief tour and enjoyed a longer lunch!










November 2021


