It is estimated that this species of bee pollinates \$15 billion worth of food crops annually in the US which make them vital to our economy and survival. 2018 saw the largest decline in the honey bee population. While pesticides contribute to their demise, Varroa mites are by far their number one enemy. Ray talked about the proper management of these colonies by beekeepers as well as what we can to do encourage growth of this vital population in our neighborhood.
